


SCHOOL OF THOUGHT



Why do we need to talk about climate change?

Take it further:

THINK

What curiosity questions can you ask?

e.g. What does climate change mean? Why is the climate changing? Why do some people not want to talk about climate change? Who do you have that you can talk to?

FEEL

How might different people feel about this?

e.g. What are some of the feelings that you have when you think about climate change? Where in your body do you experience these sensations? What helps you to feel calm and secure when thinking and feeling about climate change?


CONNECT What links can you start to make?

e.g. Why is it good for us to be about climate change? Why is it good to share how we are thinking and how we are feeling with other people?

Activity ideas:

1. What is climate change? What is the difference between climate and weather? Read our short story book about Vole and friends and join them on a journey to find out more by talking about climate change:

2. Talking with others, sharing how we feel and the things we have learned can help others to understand what is happening with climate change. Some people find it very easy to talk about the issues and ideas surrounding climate change, whilst some people don't wish to talk about it at all.

Having simple conversations really can encourage people to think about changes they can make in their own lives – small pledges that can make a big difference and feel great to take.
