# Take it further:

#### THINK

#### What curiosity questions can you ask?

e.g. What do you think of when you hear the word culture? What is your culture? What habits and traditions do you follow? Where did they come from? Do you practice any traditions from more than one culture?

#### FEEL

#### How might different people feel about this?

e.g. What are your favourite parts about the culture you are part of (e.g. food, music, clothing?) How do these make you feel? Would you miss your culture if you had to leave it behind? Why?

### CONNECT What links can you start to make?

e.g. Why are there so many different cultures around the world? Where do they all come from? What is the link between language and culture? What can we learn from different cultures and traditions?

## Activity ideas:

Around the world, people speak many different languages in each country and greet each other in very different ways.
 How many languages can you say hello in? Here's a quick video to teach you to say hello in 15 different languages – explore and see how many you already know and how many you can learn: Hello around the world

Take it further and learn how different cultures greet each other with hand gestures and body language: <u>Greetings from around the world</u>

- What does culture mean?
   Find an old magazine or newspaper and create a culture collage. Think about all of the words, images, colours, symbols, shapes, ideas, foods, traditions, costumes etc. that you think of when you hear the word culture.
- 3. Let's celebrate culture!

There are hundreds of different cultures and traditions around the world, each with their own unique ingredients. Why not have a cultural celebration in your home to celebrate your own culture, or another culture from around the world. To begin, choose a particular culture and then design a day for your cultural celebration. Things to plan and think about: food, clothes, music, language, traditions (e.g. dancing, singing) and any other unique elements from that culture.
